Community Care Fund/Allocations Process

80 volunteers contributed more than 2,500 hours reviewing agency financials and performance, participating in agency presentations and site visits, and finally, determining how to best allocate funds

Emergency Food & Shelter

over \$401,435 in funding provided help with rent, mortgage, utility, food and emergency shelter assistance

Point in Time Count/Continuum of Care Coalition

increased the capacity of local organizations to reduce homelessness by taking a leadership role in the Coalition - in partnership with Brevard County Health & Human Services Department and local volunteers counted 1,899 homeless in Brevard, nearly double the number counted last year

Partners in Parenting (Parenting Education Program)

23 volunteers and nurses enabled 49 families to successfully complete the program

Food Drives

promoted local food drives like the National Association of Letter Carriers Food Drive and the Boy Scouts "Scouting for Food" helping to collect over 500,000 pounds of food
